All exams will be held at Ilves-Theatre (Sampsantie 50, 00610 Helsinki). The jury will make decisions about the applicants between the exam days based on the given assignments.

A friendly reminder: While working with the pre-assignments and also during the entrance exams, please stay honest to yourself and your own interests. **Please be aware that the assignments should not have such content that would need content warnings**. Always go primarily towards what is meaningful to you.

PRE-ASSIGNMENT 2 — FICTIONAL FAMILY TREE

Write a fictional family tree. You can write the text as yourself or as a fictional character. This writing assignment may be used as a material during the exams.

The maximum length of the text is 0,5 page (A4) with the font Times New Roman, font size 12 and line spacing 1,5. You can also attach an A4 size drawing. Return the assignment as a **PDF-file** and name it `Firstname_Lastname_O2`

PRE-ASSIGNMENT 3 – Performance plan

Choose one of the materials below. Form three observations, perspectives or questions that you find interesting in the material you have chosen, and then make a presentation plan inspired by one of them. List all three of your observations/perspectives/questions and name your presentation at the beginning of the task.

You can use the following questions as guidance:

- What catches your attention in the material?
- What interests you? What doesn't?
- Is there any voltage included in the material? Why? Between whom/what?
- What kind of atmosphere does the material have? Is it changing? Why?
- Is the material suggesting any situations? What kind of situation? What do you think of the situation?
- What kind of scenery does the material create?

The maximum length of the text is 1 page (A4) with the font New Times Roman, font size of 12 and line spacing of 1,5. Use your play's name as the heading for the text.

Return the assignment as a **PDF-file** and name it Firstname_Surname_O3.


Performance plan is a brief abstract in which the maker of the performance tries to describe the performance comprehensively before making it. Performance plan often contains the primal starting points of making the performance. For example, the performance plan can contain what kind of acting, aesthetics, genre, soundscape, lighting or space is desired. Performance plans may be accurate and detailed or more open and process-oriented. A performance plan is often used as a tool when creating a performance even though the final performance may be different to the performance plan.

You may be asked more about your performance plan in the entrance exams.
